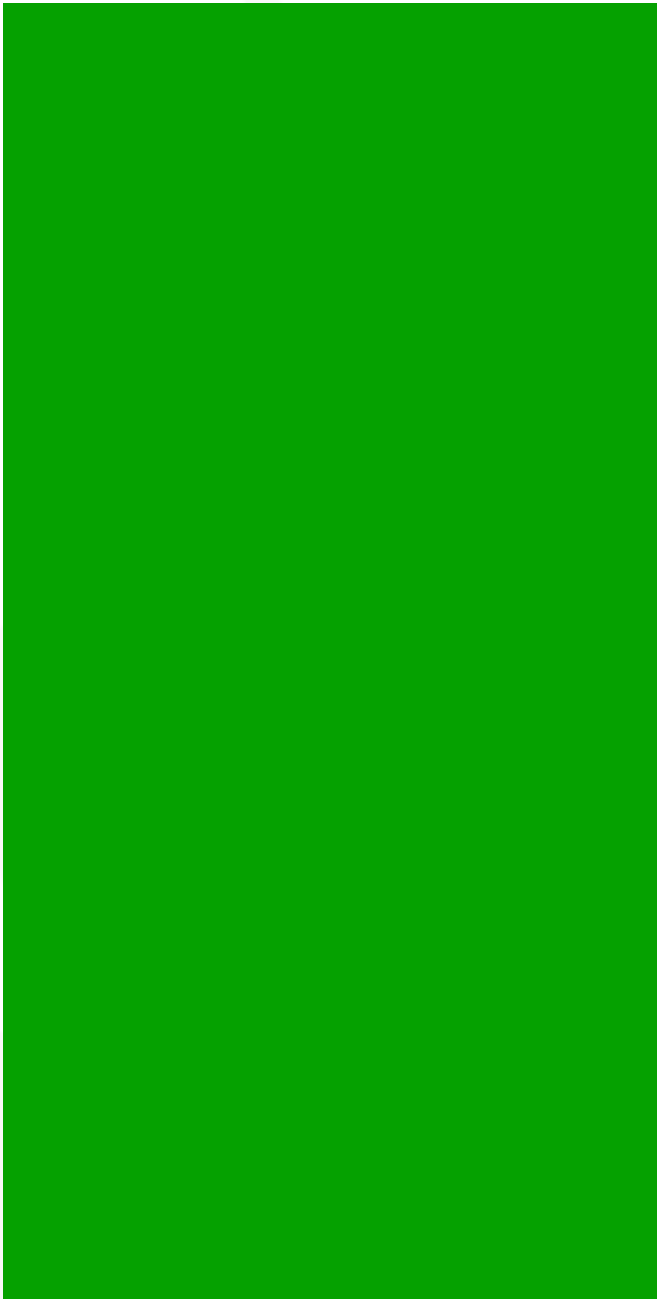
HOW TO USE THIS RESOURCE

Visuals play a crucial role in supporting their understanding and organization skills. Research has shown that individuals with autism often benefit from visual supports, as they enhance comprehension and reduce anxiety.

The task list provides a clear structure, allowing children to visually see their tasks and track their progress. The green column represents the tasks they need to complete, while the red column signifies completed tasks. This visual representation helps children with autism comprehend the steps required and provides a sense of accomplishment when they move a task to the “done” column.

By utilizing visual supports like task lists, we create a visual framework that aids in organizing their thoughts and actions, ultimately promoting independence and reducing frustration.
